PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES IN NEW ZEALAND

Food Watch Program

Food Watch Program and Equip with Knowledge and tools programs based in New Zealand. We use local resources and network with local organisations and businesses by using their resources to support families. HOPE in collaboration with Bread & Butter is running a Food Watch Programme in Auckland, New Zealand.

The objective of this initiative is to fulfil the food needs to those families who are facing difficulties in meeting their dietary needs for various reasons.

The HOPE team collects food and bread etc. from "Bread & Butter" and distributes to those who struggle to put food on the table. With both social and environmental benefits, this intervention is a 'win-win'. We run this program at a very minimum cost because of huge support from volunteers.







During this financial year we have supported more than 200 families and individuals in South Auckland and more than 500 families throughout the year in West Auckland with more than 5000 loaves of bread and other food items. These donated food items were donated to the community members who have reached out to us directly through social media (Facebook or messenger), word of mouth and many that have been referred through community organizations and social workers.









World Social Work Day-2020

Social Workers provide their services in different settings and in order to achieve people's goals, they help and support people to build and develop their skills. Social Workers provide support, care and advise people to deal with their social problems and help them make decisions.

World Social Work Day 2020 was organised for celebration on 17th March 2020. This year's theme for World Social Work Day was "Promoting the importance of human relationships". Putting people first ahead of yourself, is what we directly connect with in social work. Placing people first whilst looking at the bigger picture.







Social Workers from diverse backgrounds attended the event and shared their ideas. Social Workers working in the field of elderly, mental health, refugees and asylum seekers, addiction and homeless issues and health professionals, humanitarian aid workers also attended the event. We at HOPE with the support of Aotearoa Resettled Community Coalition showed our great appreciation to all Social Workers for offering and delivering their outstanding services for the community. We highly admire their love, compassion, empathy and commitment to the Social Work Profession. Certificates of recognition were given out to all social workers who attended the event.

Cultural Diversity





Implementing Partner Organization in Pakistan

Women Shelter Organization (WSO) in Faisalabad –Pakistan signed the Memorandum of Understanding as an "Implementing Partner Organization" (IPO) with HOPE in September 2019. WSO and HOPE has agreed to implement a project titled "Uplifting of underprivileged women through capacity building and awareness raising" October 2019 - March 2020.

Community Meeting on Women's Rights

Main theme of the meeting was aligning to the slogan "Women's Rights as Human Rights" and highlight this discourse. More Than 50 men and women including children attended this meeting at Ibn-e-Maryam Colony, Faisalabad. Executive lead members from WSO and local district council representatives shared about the importance of human rights, Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW).

Many young women and girls endorsed the receipt of extended knowledge about International Human Rights Instrument and women's rights treaty.



Seminar on International Girl Child Day

WSO organized one day seminar at Chak # 241/R.B, Chanchal Singh Wala, Faisalabad, More than 100 men and women including children attended this meeting. Students of Shelter Primary School Faisalabad also presented a beautiful Punjabi cultural Show on this occasion.



Community Meeting on Human Rights

Event has attracted young men, women and girls from different communities and shared about the importance of human rights for every human being and shared about the universal declaration of human rights, and CEDAW. Women leaders emphasised that we should respect each other's rights and we should give the equal rights to women as well as they are equal human being.




Gender Equality and women empowerment is a cross cutting theme in all our interventions. To ensure gender inclusion and women empowerment the HOPE team of volunteers in Pakistan run Workshops, Seminar and awareness sessions at grass root level by involving volunteers from the community. 250-300 women and youth have benefited from different workshops and seminars run in different urban and rural areas of Pakistan.

Human Rights Education (HRE) Program been delivered at community level in different cities. The program focused to empowering young people and seeks to build stronger just and fair societies. At HOPE we believe that Human Rights Education and awareness is very important and as an organisation, we would like to address this matter consistently.

We projected and successfully raised awareness through organising workshops/training sessions for Human Rights awareness and educating the masses and women in specific in their civil and basic Human rights. .. More than 300 youth from three cities of Faisalabad, Lahore and Rawalpindi were involved in the seminars and attended Human Rights awareness Sessions.











Resilience and Disaster Risk Reduction



HOPE has been focusing on increasing resilience among the local communities as well as school children in selected areas. For this, initiatives such as raising awareness regarding an early warning system, hazard vulnerability and capacity assessment were implemented with the local communities. Similarly, simulation exercises with school children also held in case of an earthquake, and the need of any first aid etc.

Throughout this financial year 500 school children and over 2000 community members are covered in the project area. Similarly, another 500 school children and 1500 community members were planned to be covered but due to financial constraints and lack of volunteers, we could not continue with that intention.





PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES IN THAILAND

Bangkok Asylum Seekers Support Program







HOPE has provided support to vulnerable Refugees and Asylum seekers in Bangkok. We encourage and motivate urban refugees and asylum seekers in Bangkok to teach their children in their rooms by using recycled stationary. During this financial year we have provided recycled stationary and books to refugees and asylum seekers children.

We are thrilled to have support from "All Heart NZ" and donated laptops to minors and to refugees who have already been accepted by New Zealand Immigration and are waiting their air tickets.


Case Study

A young refugee woman (pregnant) Mrs.Julia (not real name) who has been brutally beaten and lost twins in her womb. She escaped from her homeland and now seeking refuge in Bangkok. As a result of this traumatic incident which has potentially caused physical, emotional, spiritual, or psychological harm, she has been experiencing great distress. She has felt threatened, anxious, scared or frightened as a result and has a fear of losing her life and her family.

We have been providing support to this person to recover from the traumatic event and regain emotional and mental stability to have a happier and healthier life. We have helped her to transform specific (traumatic) negative events into more positive ones.

We also encouraged and engaged her to adopt Self Management Strategies such as self-soothing and mindfulness, which are helpful to ground a person and bring them back to reality after a flashback. Our trained volunteers reached out to Julia ,to support her and helped her to overcome obstacles and barriers. Here are the steps as to how cognitive restructuring and re-framing has been used into six simple steps that helped Julia to overcome her anxiety and fear.

She is in a safer environment, receiving ongoing support such as food, shelter and ongoing social connection.


