

A big thank you to all our volunteers, members, supporters and professionals around the world, who in spite of the challenges impersonated by the pandemic, live our values and continued to support in delivering our services.

Thanks to The Foundation North, Ministry of Social Development, Lottery Community and Ethnic Communities Development Fund for providing financial resources to implement the organization's programs and objectives. These funds have significantly improved the effectiveness of our programs during and post pandemic and reached out to many families during and post to the unrepresented times.

HOPE has expanded to the South Island for the first time and established a branch office in Masterton. The Masterton branch intend to support the families with their social needs including housing, MSD, driver license program, social connections, health and wellbeing. Masterton is a strategic city as it is one of the 10 new resettlement locations the government has identified.

HOPE's work has always been strategically aligned to the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) set out by the United Nations (UN). The global agenda for development aims to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure prosperity for all by 2030.

HOPE in its work strives to bring about the positive change envisioned in the SDGs. Most of HOPE's development and humanitarian relief programs are multidimensional; with our focus areas, designed to work across sectors and contribute to multiple SDGs simultaneously.

HOPE supports the key outcome areas of the New Zealand's migration strategy's, such as, Employment, Education and skill training, English language, Inclusion, and Health & wellbeing. We bring families, communities, and cultures together by encouraging people and families to learn about each other and about Aotearoa New Zealand.

Throughout this financial year we have hosted community meals, skills development, cultural events, and outings for our communities to meet and connect with others who also chose Aotearoa New Zealand for a better life for their whanau.

I am very pleased to share that HOPE has been officially recognized and accredited to participate and contribute at the First International Migration Review Forum 2022. In order to build momentum for the review of the implementation of the Global Compact on Migration objectives (GCM), we will produce material, technical notes, capacity building and safe migration promotional material for safe and orderly migration to support Smooth and safe integration of migrants and refugees.

Fostering Manaakitanga and Whakawhanaungatanga

We are a not-for-profit organization working to improve the lives of former refugees, asylum seekers, and immigrants as they find their place within Aotearoa New Zealand vibrant communities.

Driven by the Māori processes of **Manaakitanga** – showing respect, generosity and care for others – and **Whakawhanaungatanga** – establishing relationships, and relating well to others – we provide a range of services, initiatives and events for anyone in Auckland seeking food, financial support, advice or simply connection.

HOPE is a non-governmental and not-for-profit organization, Incorporated under the Charitable Trusts Act 1957 and a Registered Charity under the Charities Act 2005 in New Zealand.

HOPE is a faith-based Humanitarian Organization working towards Poverty Eradication. The organization works to empower the marginalized and deprived communities enabling them to fight for their rights and support them through providing opportunities, advocacy and empowering to become an effective part of the society.



Food Watch Program





Number of meals delivered to families during challenging times

HOPE's Social Inclusion Program brings families, communities, and cultures together. It encourages people and families to learn about each other and about Aotearoa New Zealand. It is a great space to express joy, boost confidence and achieve aspirations. It is a wonderful place to meet and connect with people from other parts of the world who decided to leave their country of origin and come to Aotearoa New Zealand in search of better life for their whanau.

Social Inclusion Program is designed to build connections,, improves mental wellbeing, raise confidence and self-esteem of the community members.

The trainings, activities and programs are well gender, age, and ethnic balance. More than thirteen ethnic communities engaged and reported enhanced community connections, confidence and emotional wellbeing.

Our activities promote the community wellness by bush walk, beach walk, picnics, community BBQ, and outdoor games like cricket, soccer and other activities that includes physical movements and positive engagement with others.

Our Culture Our Identity

our cultural events show case our diversity and our cultures. As new kiwis from migrant backgrounds, connect with tāngata whenua, it not only helps to learn T Reo, but also leads to access many other opportunities while discovering commonalities. This year we hosted 4 cultural events.

We are bound by the principles of Te Tiriti o Waitangi (Treaty of Waitangi) as New Zealanders irrespective of race, gender, ethnicity, country of birth, religious or political associations. HOPE intends to provide opportunities for new migrants and former refugee families to learn about Te Reo Maori and encourage families and individuals to learn about the Treaty of Waitangi as a founding document of Aotearoa- New Zealand.



PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT PROGRAM

Psychosocial support is a tool for community outreach. Using this, means to connect communities, HOPE responds to the needs of former refugees, migrants and asylum seekers families and individuals who are disconnected from the society.

HOPE also reaches out by offering specialized services to the families with little or no other means of support. The program helped HOPE to create a transport system to lift burden from the families that have no means of transport when they go for GP visits or go shopping or to vaccination centers.

Psychosocial support promotes overall health and wellbeing activities. HOPE provided face masks, health, hygiene kits to the families; conducted webinars on health education and also offered Covid-19 support (food delivery to the families in self-isolation).

World Social Workday

The theme: 'Co-building a New Eco-Social World: Leaving No One Behind'

HOPE acknowledges and appreciates the social workers for their resilience, dedication, hard work and commitment to make a difference in the community. Every year, HOPE celebrates World Social Work day by engaging social workers and appreciating their work. Social Workers from diverse backgrounds and ethnicities were acknowledged and medals of appreciation were awarded.



World Refugee Day

This is a day to look back and reflect on the painful journeys experienced by those who escaped war, and people with the well-founded fear of persecution based on religion, ethnicity, gender or sexual orientation. World refugee day is a global event which is commemorated on 20th June every year. HOPE, as a humanitarian organization and a human rights believer, considers this day seriously and uses it to connect communities, share stories and appreciate the success experienced by the people from the lived experiences.

Zoom Meetings

We have come to acknowledge that Covid-19 will not go away but we need to live with it. We lessen the spread by vaccination, adherence to health protection guidelines as advised by New Zealand Ministry of Health. We worked remotely to minimize the spread. During the Covid-19 restrictions, HOPE encourages staff and volunteers to meet remotely to minimize transmission.

Zoom meetings helps us to connect with our local and international links. Zoom allows us to deliver some of our community empowerment trainings to our refugee and asylum seeker communities in Pakistan, Thailand, Sri Lanka and Indonesia.



Community BBQ

Community outings like BBQs, bush walks, exposure to nature enable families to have their voice heard and have access to have their ends meet.

HOPE exercised Whakawhanaungatanga, Manaakitanga, Awhinatia and Tautoko for Food Watch Program and a Social Integration and Support Program which is not only assisting former refugees and asylum seekers, it encompasses and includes the many other isolated and vulnerable group of people (mainly senior citizens , Maori ,Pacifica and Ethnic Communities) to overcome obstacles and barriers.



Storytelling and engagement through food keeps us connected. Our community is rich in diversity, and we want to maintain it in any way possible. BBQ events are our way of maintaining our diversity. We reduce isolation and barriers to integration although this year has been a difficult one due to the Covid pandemic.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

Supporting families
Minimizing waste

Kai Ika (Kai means Food and Ika means Fish the in Maori language) this is a new partner with whom we have been collaborating to connect communities through fish head distribution. The collaboration reduced food insecurity, and minimized wastes.

To reduce environmental impact, we promote the usage of reusable bags rather than plastic bags and encourage people to use recycled materials.

HOPE addresses food insecurity in vulnerable communities by rescuing good quality food , fish heads and filleting leftovers that could go to landfill .

HOPE proudly collaborates with The Kai Ika project and every week we receive roughly close or more than **200 KG** fish head and body leftovers and these are given to families to make use of these surplus fish parts.

Families reported that they enjoy making soup and different dishes. Families also expressed their thanks and told that due to the high price of fish and meat, these foods are not affordable and they are very thankful.



Educational Workshops and Awareness Campaign

HOPE incorporates climate change into its operations in accordance with New Zealand's climate change policy, which is aligned with the Paris Climate Change Agreement signed in France in 2015.

HOPE encourages families to minimize climate impact by using reusable shopping bags when families come and pick their food parcel and do their daily grocery shopping. HOPE hands out recycled bags to families that have a limited food budget.

We have set up a plastic bag recycling depot at our base. We encourage families to bring in their old ones for recycling, after they've re-used them several times.




Total of 345 ,000 KG diverted from landfill






HOPE Chapter in Pakistan






