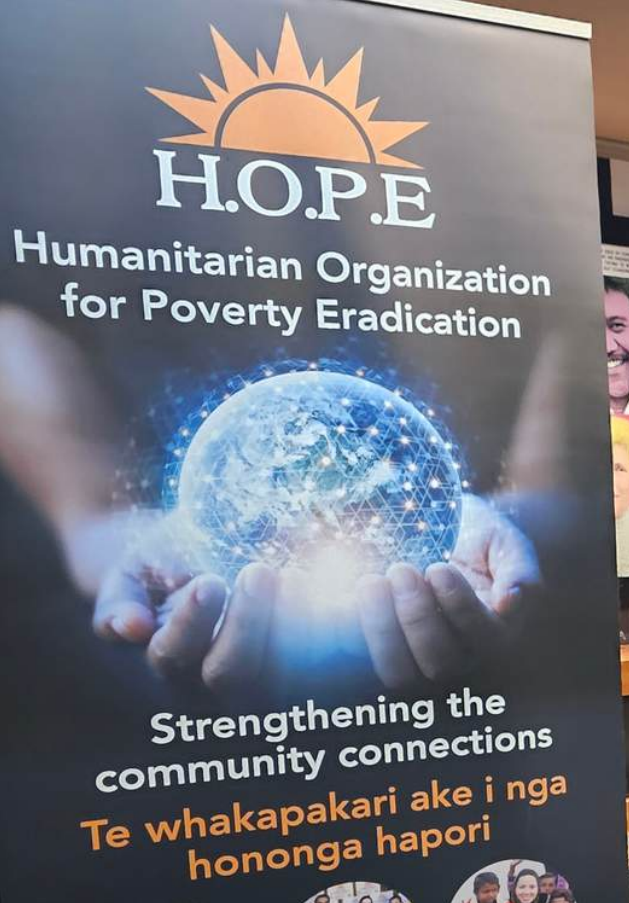

Our commitment to promoting and safeguarding the fundamental human rights of vulnerable groups, including migrants, asylum seekers, and refugees, continues to drive our mission forward.

This past year has been transformative for our organization. We have expanded our Community Organization Refugee Sponsorship Program (CORS) to include refugees from Indonesia and Iran, in addition to those from Pakistan, Nepal, Malaysia, Thailand, and Kenya.

Through the Food Watch Program, we have rescued over 650,000 kg of food, supporting 120-150 families weekly. Our social inclusion efforts have included numerous cultural events and workshops that foster understanding and inclusion, helping to build stronger, more resilient communities.

Looking ahead, we are committed to expanding our social inclusion programs, enhancing professional development for our team, and building sustainable partnerships. We will continue to prioritize health and safety, ensuring that all volunteers and staff receive the necessary training to support our mission.

Our participation in international forums such as the International Migration Review Forum, COP 28 at UNFCCC, UNHCR consultations, and GNDR further underscores our dedication to global collaboration. We will continue to advocate for and support refugees and marginalized communities worldwide.

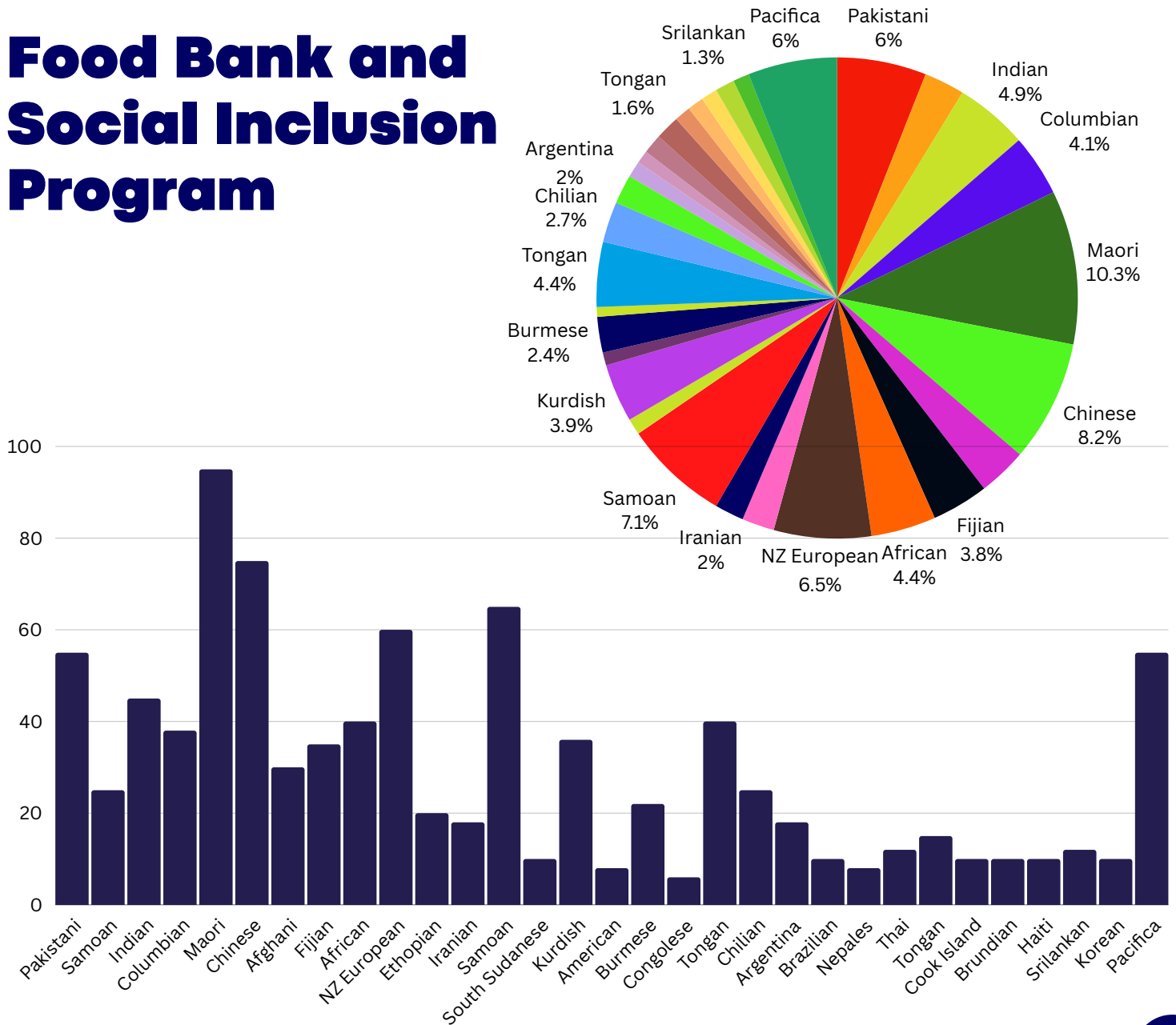

New Zealand Charitable Activities

Funds raised for New Zealand initiatives are deposited into a dedicated account and used solely for local programs. This ensures all contributions benefit communities within New Zealand, supporting projects such as the Food Watch Program and Social Inclusion Program. Every dollar raised in New Zealand is dedicated to enhancing the lives of individuals and families here.

Overseas Charitable Activities

Funds for our overseas projects are managed through separate accounts. These funds support our efforts in Pakistan, Thailand, Nepal, and Kenya, focusing on aiding refugees and vulnerable populations. This separation ensures that international contributions are used effectively to meet the specific needs of those communities.

Leadership and Volunteer Support

We would like to acknowledge the outstanding volunteer role of Azmat Jabeen, our International Lead. Azmat oversees and provides support to our overseas operations, particularly in Pakistan, engaging with volunteers, members, and partner organizations. Her dedication ensures our mission is effectively carried out across all regions.

By maintaining clear distinctions between our New Zealand and overseas activities, HOPE Worldwide-Pakistan ensures accountability and transparency, fostering trust among our supporters and beneficiaries.

INTERNATIONAL ENGAGEMENT AND STRENGTHENING PARTNERSHIPS

HOPE Worldwide-Pakistan has formalized strategic partnerships with several notable organizations to enhance our support for vulnerable individuals and families, particularly refugees and asylum seekers.

Key Partnerships:

SHARP and ALIGHT: HOPE Worldwide-Pakistan has signed MOUs with SHARP and ALIGHT to support Afghan refugees in Pakistan. These refugees will be nominated by HOPE under the Community Organization Refugee Sponsorship (CORS) program. Our collaboration aims to provide comprehensive support, including on ground support and assisting in, healthcare, and education to Afghan refugees.

Roots of Generation: In February 2024 at Global Summit in Kenya, HOPE and Roots of Generation has signed an MOU to assist vulnerable individuals, families, and refugees in Kenya, as well as a possible support to vulnerable populations in South Sudan. This partnership focuses on delivering essential services, community development programs, and advocacy efforts to support these populations.
