Treaty of Waitangi Workshops for New Kiwis





"Embracing **Overview:** The Biculturalism" project successfully delivered a series of Treaty of Waitangi workshops to 120 kiwis including, new Auckland, Kiwis focusing in on fostering a deeper understanding of Maori culture and promoting bi cultural awareness.

The workshops were held over several months, with participants from diverse backgrounds, including former refugees, asylum seekers, and migrants.

The project aimed to bridge cultural gaps, enhance social inclusion, and empower participants with the knowledge necessary to integrate smoothly into New Zealand society.



















Key Achievements:

The project facilitated the building of meaningful relationships between participants and Maori community members, fostering mutual respect and collaboration. This has laid the foundation for ongoing engagement and support between the communities involved.

Language Barriers:

While translation services were provided, some participants faced challenges due to language differences. Future projects may benefit from additional multilingual resources and more extensive language support.

Logistics:

Organizing transportation for participants without access to travel means was a logistical challenge that required significant coordination. Ensuring easy access to future workshops will be crucial for broader participation.

Impact and Future Directions:

The project has made a significant impact on the participants, enhancing their understanding of Maori culture and the Treaty of Waitangi, which is vital for their successful integration into New Zealand society. The success of this project has highlighted the importance of cultural education for new immigrants and has set a precedent for similar initiatives in the future.

Moving forward, the project team plans to expand the reach of these workshops, incorporating more in-depth cultural exchanges and continued support for new Kiwis as they settle into their new communities.
