







SOCIAL INCLUSION AND WELLNESS IMPACT OVERVIEW



CORS is a compassionate and community-led pathway through which eligible New Zealand-based organisations — like HOPE Worldwide-Pakistan — sponsor and support the resettlement of refugees in Aotearoa New Zealand.

This initiative is grounded in the belief that refugees can thrive when local communities are involved in their welcome, care, and long-term integration.

COMPREHENSIVE SUPPORT FOR SPONSORED REFUGEES UNDER COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP (CORS) PROGRAM

Through the CORS Program, HOPE Worldwide-Pakistan has sponsored 16 refugees, with 15 already resettled in Aotearoa New Zealand. We have supported them with:

- · Safe and stable housing
- Access to education and healthcare
- Employment pathways
- Cultural integration rooted in local values

Beyond this, we have provide holistic support to asylum seekers, migrants, and new arrivals — offering temporary accommodation, settlement services, and personalized guidance to help them build strong community connections.





