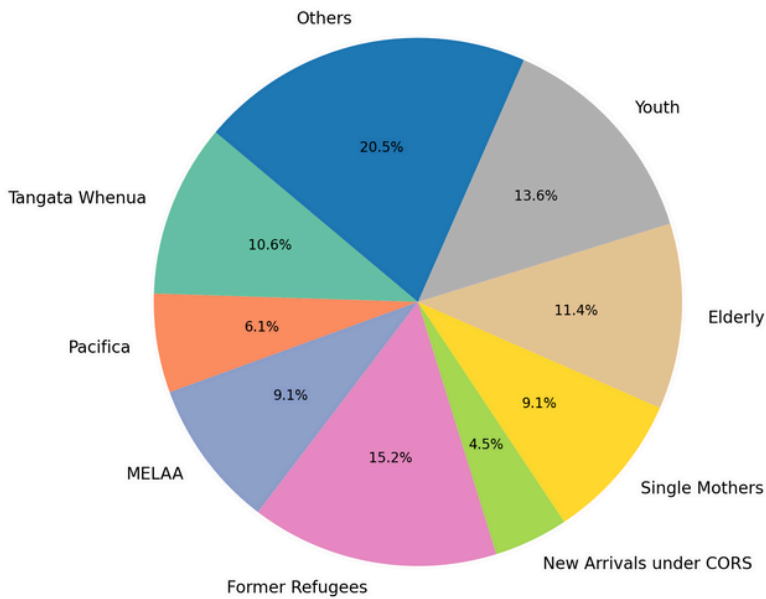

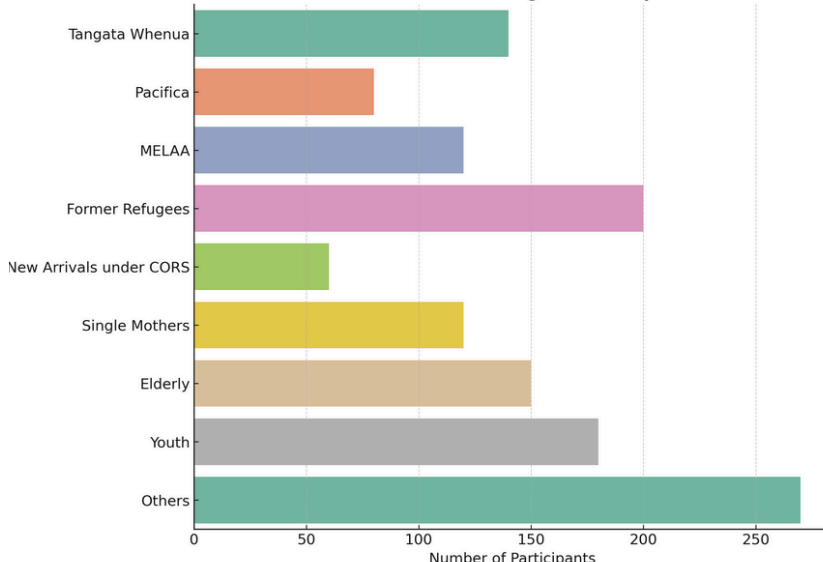

Through the CORS Program, HOPE Worldwide-Pakistan has sponsored 16 refugees, with 15 already resettled in Aotearoa New Zealand. We have supported them with:
