INFORMATIVE PRESENTATION

Constable Vipin Zinta delivered a comprehensive presentation on safety, laws and police services in New Zealand.

KEY SAFETY INFORMATION

Participants learned about emergency procedures, when to call 111, crime prevention and how to report incidents.
